There is no right or wrong way to approach the teaching of this resource. Split the topics over two years or revisit them again and again over two years. Use the topics as 5 - 10min lessons or expand them to larger lessons or units of work. There is so much flexibility!

This book includes a reflective journal, which students can use to reflect and record how they have seen the spirit of Jesus. It is divided into sections for Years 3 and Year 4 for your convenience.

FOR STUDENTS

This is your book for life. Treat it with respect, have fun, but most importantly, be honest. If you are to grow and develop your relationship with Jesus through the activities in this book then you must be honest. Don't write something that is what you think someone else 'wants to hear' even if it's for your friends, your teacher or your parents. This book is for you and you alone. Treasure it!

At the back of the book is a reflective journal for you to record where you have found the spirit of Jesus in your life.

FOR PARENTS

This book will help you in your unique role as the primary educators in your child's life. It will help equip them with skills and values such as resilience, teamwork and gratitude. It will assist you in developing their understanding of their Catholic faith and the importance of an ongoing relationship with Jesus.

As educators, we hope your child will bring these concepts home to share with you. We think that you will notice a difference in your child as they develop their relationship with Jesus – a relationship they can have for life.

HOW DO WE CONNECT WITH JESUS?
