The Nativity Scene Tradition

St Francis of Assisi is credited with creating the first nativity scene in 1223, in the small Italian town of Greccio.

According to St Bonaventure, author of *The Life of St Francis of Assisi*, St Francis gained permission from Pope Honorius III to do something “for the kindling of devotion” to the birth of Christ.

In a cave on the edge of the village, Francis set up a manger, a carved doll, a bale of hay, an ox and an ass. He then invited the villagers to come gaze upon the scene while he preached about “the babe of Bethlehem”. (Francis was supposedly so overcome by emotion that he couldn’t say “Jesus”).

Bonaventure wrote that when the blessed Father Francis embraced the doll in both arms, the doll cried tears of joy, and “seemed to be awakened from sleep”. This miracle of the crying doll moved all who were present. But, another miracle happened – the hay the child lay in, healed sick animals, and protected people from disease.

The nativity scene’s popularity took off from there. Within a couple of centuries, nativity scenes had spread throughout Europe, and then across the world.
