KWITH A SMILE

It is amazing how students can teach you, 'The Teacher'!

For many years I have been advocating for students (both young and old) to understand that backchatting/ talking back is a non-productive habit that seriously erodes family connections and values. This is especially evident when they are asked to do a simple chore at home - e.g. dishes, clean their room, mow lawns, stop playing computer games etc. Instead, I ask students to say 'OK' - with a smile and to try and make it a positive habit in their lives.

Recently, a Year 6 student came up to me during a break and, with a tear in his eye, said that he had tried this approach last year - and now his mum keeps saying to visitors, family, and friends that it is like 'having a new person in the house'. He then thanked me saying, 'I am now a much happier, friendlier person because of it.'

I usually write 'OK - with a smile' on the students hands, but another class from Deloraine in Tasmania suggested to me, 'Why not let us design our own?' Here are some of their amazing samples. I am sure they will remember these and will explain to adults at home why they have this written on their hands.







BEING ACCOUNTABLE

As mentioned in the opening paragraph, I have been taking a number of sessions about the importance of being held accountable.

At the end of these sessions. I have asked students to write a letter home asking for help in being 'Accountable' for their attitude, habits, chores etc. The response from parents/carers has been unbelievable, with many principals being contacted by parents saying they had sat down with their child and worked out how to improve family connections. I also asked some of the older classes to write the equation below over the seal of the envelope.





Make sure you align the middle of the equation over edge of the flap so it creates a line so you can see the hidden message.

This really brings a smile to faces when they open it.

MITCH'S TRAVELS

One of the lessons Mitch presents begins with asking the students the following questions:

- 1. Where do they see the 'Spirit of Jesus' in others?
- 2. Where can they better show the 'Spirit of Jesus' moments in their lives?
- 3. Where have they seen gospel values being lived?
- 4. How can they be a Team player At Home (TAH) and Team player At School (TAS)?
- 5. Have they had an 'Oh Yeah' moment during an MJR lesson or anywhere else?

These answers can then be shared with others via your school newsletter, parent/teacher communications, assemblies etc.

For teachers, Mitch shares the following thoughts ...

For me in Cath Ed, we aim for the kids to have a relationship with Jesus - plus, anyone they communicate in their busy lives. To have a relationship with anyone we have to communicate. With Jesus, we can't ring, text or email Him, but we can write about where we saw His presence in our lives. And we can also pray.



for living the Gospel message by serving others with love, respect, justice, hope and joy and working to make our school a more just community.


EXCITED!


