## FROM LITTLE THINGS **BIG THINGS GROW**

This famous Paul Kelly anthem has inspired many people and organisations with its story of patience and NGU (Never Give Up). Written by Paul Kelly and Kev Carmody in 1991, From Little Things Big Things Grow charts the struggle for land rights by the Gurindji people, led by Vincent Lingiari. It tells the story of the Wave Hill Walk-Off in 1966 through to the symbolic handing back of their land eight years later – an event which became a catalyst for the Aboriginal land rights movement.
















#### St Brendan's Catholic Primary School, Mackay

MJR is an integral part of all that they do at St Brendan's Mackay. Mitch sent these photos and the following snapshot of what they do - they started small.

#### **MJR Testimonial 2022**

It is quite a challenging task to put on paper what we have done with MJR as a new school. Suffice to say that MJR has played a very big role in the development of the religious life of our school. It provides an accessible culture and language for all students and parents, and helps bring Jesus into our everyday lives and conversations. MJR provides a simple, relatable, 21st Century lens for us to build our Catholic (Ignatian) charism around.

Our school motto is 'Finding God in All Things' - so MJR 'God Moments' were where we began. We then introduced a fortnightly MJR focus which is talked about at assemblies and in classrooms. Soon after, we developed a 'MJR School Planner' that aligned fortnightly MJR focuses with the school and liturgical calendar. We introduced a 'MJR Award' that is awarded to one student per week. We printed MJR Award certificates and the student receives the certificate at an assembly along with a MJR arm band. Running alongside this, we run fortnightly 'MJR Pastoral Groups' - where all students in the school are split into a multi-age group (P-6) and participate in a 30min lesson and activities. A host teacher and Year 6 students lead this lesson.

We use school signs, the School App, and a Parent Facebook Page to engage parents and communicate MJR messages every fortnight.

## Larmenier Catholic Primary School, Tasmania


Ray Smith and his wonderful Year 6 class completed the colouring mural that was highlighted in the June Bulletin.




They have done an amazing job of working together to colour the background, individually colouring the sheets, and then gluing them altogether to make their completed mural.

## WHY DOES MJR WORK?

Have you ever wondered where and/or why does MJR work?

Dr Dan White, previous Executive Director of both the Tasmanian and Sydney Catholic Education Offices, had this to say about MJR.

I have had the wonderful opportunity of observing Making Jesus Real in action across a number of dioceses in Australia. In many respects MJR has successfully proved to be the 'missing link' that has not only complemented and enriched our traditional Religious Education curriculums but even more importantly has underpinned the spiritual growth and formation of our young people by explicitly putting the teachings and values of Jesus at the very centre of their everyday lives.

In particular, the emphasis in MJR for children to deeply reflect daily upon how they are living out their faith in Jesus, combined with the active encouragement to regularly dialogue with their parents about what they have learnt, are real features of the program. I would seriously encourage each and every Catholic school to explore how the various MJR resources could enhance both their Religious Education and Personal Development programs.
